Charlotte, NC - The National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc. will hold its 56th Southeast District Conference at the Crowne Plaza Executive Park Hotel in Charlotte, N.C., March 13 – 16, 2014.

Prominent native Charlottean Juanita C. Miller, the District's governor and key honoree, oversees clubs in eight southeastern states from North Carolina to Florida. In addition to her distinguished 32 year career with the F.B.I., the governor has notably served the Charlotte community as founding president of the Crime Victim's Coalition, national president of the South Mecklenburg High School National Alumni Association, and as Minority Business Enterprise chairperson for the Carolinas Minority Suppliers Development Council, to name just a few. Governor Miller will leave her NANBPWC post this June, after serving a maximum four-year term.

The National Association of Negro Business and Professional Women's Clubs (NANBPWC, Inc.) is an organization whose mission is to promote and protect the interests of African American business and professional women, serve as a bridge for young people seeking to enter business and the professions, to improve the quality of life in the local and global communities, and to foster good fellowship. In addition to the Governor's Gala on Saturday night, scheduled performers include inspirational gospel recording artist, Jackie O. Kelley, and The Sycamore Project. Attendees will also tour Charlotte attractions, including the LATIBAH Museum, Charlotte's newest African-American museum, and The Harvey B. Gantt Cultural Center. Tickets for activities vary by event, and can be purchased in advance, or at the door.
