The S.T.E.P. Program is hosting its annual Holiday Court Session on Friday, Dec. 13 in the chamber of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center. The annual court session is designed to encourage program participants to remain substance-free during the holiday season through testimonials from program alumni. Research shows that the holiday season can be the source of increased stress and triggers for many battling addictions.

Participants from five adult courts are invited to attend. During the event, program alumni, S.T.E.P. team members and recovery court judges will share tips on how to celebrate the holidays in a safe and sober manner.

2019 NCAAO Assessor of the Year

Mecklenburg County Assessor Ken Joyner has received an award from the North Carolina Association of Assessing Officers for his leadership during the 2019 revaluation. Joyner was named Assessor of the Year by NCAAO on Nov. 19.

For the last three years, Joyner led his team of over 120 people through the successful launch and completion of the 2019 revaluation. Their hard work, dedication and transparency resulted in the completion of the revaluation in a timely manner, with the review of more than 380,000 parcels.

Joyner was appointed Mecklenburg County Assessor in October 2013 by the Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners.

Prior to his appointment, Ken spent six years as a faculty member at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in the School of Government, and previously served as the Tax Administrator in Chatham, Onslow, and Durham counties.
