

America Recycles Day: Wishful Recycling in Mecklenburg County Webinar and Q+A (11/16 | 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.)

Have you ever placed a plastic bag in your recycling bin? Wishful recycling is assuming that any seemingly-plastic material can be put into your curbside bin and recycled. More often than not, these materials are NOT meant to be collected or sent to our Material Recovery Facilities. Unfortunately, this wishful thinking creates contamination in the system and is counter-productive to the effectiveness of Mecklenburg County's recycling program overall.

In honor of this year's America Recycles Day, Keep Charlotte Beautiful is hosting a live webinar on November 16 with sustainability professionals from across the county to educate the community on the impact of wishful recycling. The presentations will be followed by a Q+A opportunity for viewers to ask our guest speakers any questions they may have. We hope you'll join us for this insightful conversation!

Avoid Fines on Bulky Item Pickup

Residents currently receiving garbage collection from the City of Charlotte are eligible for curbside bulky item pickup. To arrange a pickup, call 311 or schedule online <u>here</u>.

If you schedule a pickup, properly prepare items and place at the curb no more than one day before the scheduled pickup date. Items placed at the curb more than 24 hours before the scheduled collection could result in a fine of \$150.
