## What 2020 Census means for NC

- Total resident population: 10,439,388
   +903,905 or 9.5% since 2010
  - +1 seat in House of Representatives
- Fair share of >\$1.5 trillion federal dollars
   \$44 billion to NC in FY2017
- New topics in 2020 Census:
  - Same-sex relationships
  - Ancestry/origins data for all respondents



## What we know...

State total populations

- Highly accurate overall

   -0.3% undercount
   pop estimates in line with census
- All NC congressional districts will need to be redrawn

### ...and what we don't


- Populations for other geographies, population characteristics
- Differential undercount or which groups were more or less likely to be counted
- Where 14<sup>th</sup> district will go

Numeric change in total population for Southern states, 2010-2020






## Charlotte, Triangle, and Wilmington drive NC growth

Percent change in population for NC counties, 2010-2019




## Largest population losses in Northeast, Sandhills

Numeric change in population for NC counties, 2010-2019




## 38 counties with net out migration

NC counties with more people moving out than moving in, 2010-2019




### 54 counties with natural decrease

NC counties with more deaths than births, 2010-2019




## Population aging, retiree migration fuels 65+ growth

Percent increase in NC population, by age group, 2010-2019




## All NC counties have more 65+ than a decade ago

Race/ethnic composition of North Carolina population, 1990-2019



Race/ethnic composition of NC population, by age, 2019




## **Growth in Hispanic population buoys Eastern NC**

### 3 key Census Bureau data products that tell us about population...

When?	Every 10 years	Every month, every year	Every year
Who?	Every person living in the 50 states, D.C., and U.S. territories	Sample of addresses (~3.5M) in 50 states, D.C., and Puerto Rico	n.a.  Estimates are based on administrative records, such as birth and death certificates.
What?	Small set of questions, such as age, sex, race, Hispanic origin, and home ownership	Detailed social and economic topics, such as education, employment, internet access, and transportation.	Total population, components of change (births, deaths, migration), population by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin
Why?	Official count of population	Population characteristics (percents, means, medians, and rates) rather than population counts	Official count of population totals and basic characteristics in the years between censuses

#### North Carolina's Hispanic Community: 2020 Snapshot

North Carolina's Hispanic population is now greater than one million people, with 1,026,000 residents in 2019. The state's Hispanic/Latino population grew from just over 75,000 in 1990 to 800,000 in 2010. Between 2010 and 2019, the U.S. Census Bureau estimates that North Carolina's Hispanic population grew by 226,000 new residents, an increase of 28.3%, faster than the growth of this population nationwide (19.6%).
