#### Celebrates Movement's 10-Year Anniversary and Advocates for Black Funding Equity Worldwide

August 2, 2021 - Black Philanthropy Month (BPM) is set to kick off its 10th anniversary with the BPM Global Summit Series, which has been a global convening to promote funding equity and accountability to ensure equity is attainable for Black people everywhere. Since 2011, BPM has been celebrated by 18 million worldwide across 60 countries. Founded to empower Black giving, Black Philanthropy Month has emerged as a movement. This year's participants also will create a global plan to advance Black funding equity.

"Funding equity is the last frontier of the global struggle for racial justice," says Dr. Jackie Bouvier Copeland, Founder of Black Philanthropy Month and The Women Invested to Save Earth (WISE) Fund. "Until Black people everywhere have fair access to private capital, we won't be free. For our 10th Anniversary, Black Philanthropy Month brings our leaders together with allies to *make equity real* for Black people everywhere."

The BPM 2021 Global Summit series is set to kick off on August 3rd in the U.S. with virtual events continuing in Africa, Brazil, Canada, the Caribbean, and worldwide. The series will culminate on August 31st with Reunity, an international power and wellness summit for Black women of all identities and their allies, in collaboration with The WISE Fund and the Women's Philanthropy Institute at Indiana University Lilly School of Philanthropy. The event also will feature the inaugural "Black Women Give Back List," a campaign with the Women's Philanthropy Institute to highlight 10 incredible Black women philanthropists who use their time, talent, treasure, testimony and/or ties to make the world a better place.

"As the world mobilizes from Minneapolis to Rio and beyond, Black Philanthropy Month has become more critical than ever to make racial equity and economic justice a reality for Black People globally," says Darren Walker, president of the Ford Foundation.

Featured speakers include CNN political analyst and former member of South Carolina House of Representatives, Bakari Sellers; ABC News senior legal correspondent and co-host of The View, Sunny Hostin; Nobel Peace Laureate and founder of the Gbowee Peace Foundation, The Honorable Leymah Gbowee; and faith leader and activist, Reverend Naomi Tutu.

The BPM 10th anniversary continues its tradition of using high-impact technology to convene influential Black civic, business, and funding leaders with people from all walks of life to build community and practical action plans for funding equity and impact. BPM has been recognized at the outset from the United Nations as part of its Global Decade for People of African Descent and has received proclamations from 30 governmental bodies.
