## Clerk's Office Encourages Residents to Serve on Information Services & Technology (ISTC) Committee

The County is seeking applicants from District 1 and 4 to fill vacancies on the Information Services & Technology (ISTC) Committee. ISTC serves as an advisory group to the Board of County Commissioners and reviews plans at a conceptual level for major new automated systems with respect to justification of the system, adequacy of the system functions, along with availability of technology and personnel resources. Members are expected to have expertise in managing Information Systems and will be tasked with providing feedback to the Board (when necessary) on ITS challenges.
