2024 Legislative Session In Recess



The NCGA ended our official short session in June. As a result, there have been no committee meetings or votes over the last two weeks. I'll keep you posted about any special sessions that may arise.

Child Care Cliff Update: A Dramatic Decrease In Licensed Child Care Programs




Childcare is critical for working families and for our state's economy. The number of licensed child care programs in North Carolina has decreased by 5.3% in the last four years, but that loss increased rapidly this year. Using data provided by the NC Child Care Resource and Referral Council and the NC Division of Child Development and Early Education, EdNC found that 40% of the net loss in these programs that has occurred since the beginning of the pandemic happened between June 2023 and June 2024. While the General Assembly approved \$67.5 million to extend compensation grants to child care providers in an attempt to stave off the funding cliff created by the end of federally-funded grant programs, that amount is only a fraction of what we will need to fill the gap caused by the expiration of the federal government's childcare subsidies. Instead of "falling off a funding cliff, North Carolina's licensed child care system is now rolling down a steep hill toward the end of 2024," according to Katie Dukes with EdNC. Toll Road Text Scam



The Federal Bureau of Investigation put out an alert warning Americans of a new scam involving outstanding tolls citizens supposedly owe. One such scam involves texts claiming to be sent on behalf of the NC Turnpike Authority, which operates toll roads in Mecklenburg County and around the state. **The Turnpike Authority will never request toll payments via text.** If you receive a text with a link to a website claiming to request payment for outstanding tolls, **it is fake.** The correct website to pay tolls is www.ncquickpass.com. Sneaker Recycling in Davidson Update



In May, News of Davidson announced a sneaker recycling program in which they would donate any proceeds made to the Davidson Veterans Monument Fund. Though they originally planned for Town Day to be the one event at which they collected sneakers, Town Day was canceled due to inclement weather. However, the efforts of CrossFit Davidson, the Davidson Area Running Team, and CSD Spartan 5k runners meant that the cancellation of Town Day had almost no impact on the collection process. By late May, News of Davidson had collected more than 300 pairs of shoes. Due to the program's initial success throughout the town, News of Davidson has continued collecting sneakers, and will continue to donate any proceeds to the Davidson Veterans Monument Fund.

Sneaker recycling bins are located at Town Hall (inside the main entrance on South Street), CrossFit Davidson, and the Davidson Branch Library. August 10: Davidson Fire Department Invites Community to "Stuff the Truck"



Mecklenburg County Homes Program Now Available for Homeowners in Charlotte and Davidson



The Helping Out Mecklenburg Homeowners with Economic Support (HOMES) Program has returned for another season. From **July 1 – Nov. 22, 2024**, Mecklenburg County is partnering with the City of Charlotte and the Town of Davidson to provide **grant funding to qualifying residential homeowners to help address the rising costs of retaining their homes**. Program recipients must apply for consideration annually.

Grant funds will be paid to the Mecklenburg County Tax Collector, **who will reduce the total amount of taxes due for qualifying recipients' primary residence**. The amount granted will equal 35% of the Mecklenburg County tax amount on the last available tax bill, rounded to the nearest dollar, not to exceed \$648.

Applicants must not be participants in any of the following programs:

- North Carolina Homestead Exclusion
- North Carolina Property Tax Homestead Circuit Breaker
- North Carolina Disabled Veterans Exclusion
- North Carolina Present Use Value (PUV) Program

To be eligible:

- The property must be located within Mecklenburg County, NC.
- The property must be the owner's legal primary residence at the time of application and consistently for the past three consecutive years, as verified by recorded legal documents.
- The resident grant recipient's name(s) must be on the recorded deed, title, or life estate.

North Carolina Summer Meals Programs for Kids



More than 900,000 North Carolina students rely on the nutritious meals and snacks served during the school year through the School Breakfast, School Lunch and Afterschool Snack Programs. When school is out, those low-income children lose access to meals. Summer Meals Programs provide nutritious meals at no cost for children and adolescents ages 18 and younger to help close that gap.

To find nutritious summer meals at no-cost near you for kids and teens:

Sun Bucks



The USDA has launched a permanent program to provide food assistance to children and families during the summer. SUN Bucks will provide grocery-buying benefits to qualifying families with school-aged children during the summer months when schools are on summer break. SUN Bucks will be issued to EBT cards that families can use to purchase nutritious food. Beginning in summer 2024, families will receive \$120 per eligible child for the summer period. Some families will have to apply for the program, but many students will automatically qualify. Children will automatically qualify if they already participate in any of the following programs:

- Free or Reduced-Price (FRP) meals at school because they have an approved FRP application at school, or
- Food and Nutrition Services (FNS, food stamps), or
- Work First (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), cash assistance), or
- Medicaid with household income below 185% of the federal poverty level, or
- Foster care.

Families will be able to use their EBT cards to buy food at grocery stores, farmers' markets, and [some online retailers](#). 
